## **Notes**

**5RB** is committed to equality of opportunity and a policy of non-discrimination on grounds of sex, race, disability, sexual orientation, religion, belief including political affiliation or age. To ensure equality of opportunity, and in accordance with Bar Council guidelines, we require each applicant for mini-pupillage to complete and submit a standard application form. A copy of the form is attached. Applications for mini-pupillage at **5RB** must be made using this form. For the avoidance of doubt, the number of mini-pupils we seek to recruit for each mini-pupillage programme and the content of the programme remains as stated on the Mini-pupillage page of chambers' website: see <a href="https://www.5rb.com/recruitment/mini-pupillage">www.5rb.com/recruitment/mini-pupillage</a>.

In considering applications for mini-pupillage we will apply substantially the same objective criteria as are applied to written applications for pupillage. These are as follows: academic achievement; relevant experience and skills; character and aptitude, including motivation for the Bar; motivation for **5RB** and interest in and commitment to the areas of law in which we specialise. The form is designed to give an applicant the chance to address each of these criteria and also to tell us why he or she would benefit from mini-pupillage at **5RB**. The point score that will be allocated to the applicant's answer to each question by the member of chambers evaluating the applications is set out in the form.

Please bear in mind that we neither require nor expect applicants for mini-pupillage to have studied or be studying for a law degree, still less subjects relevant to the areas in which we practise. Please also bear in mind that **candidates for pupillage** are **not** required to have undertaken a mini-pupillage at **5RB**. However, if you are considering applying for pupillage at **5RB**, it is recommended that you apply for a mini-pupillage with us as it will enable you to meet members of chambers and see at first hand the type of work we are involved in.

5RB strongly believes, and is committed to ensuring, that students from all backgrounds should be able to undertake mini-pupillage with us at the minimum expense to themselves. We aim to improve access to the Bar for all. We therefore offer all mini-pupils, if needed, a grant of up to £100 to reimburse reasonable accommodation and travel expenses. Decisions on grants are made separately from the decision on whether an applicant is invited to attend mini-pupillage.

Please also note that **5RB** is committed to making reasonable adjustments to enable suitably qualified applicants for mini-pupillage who are disabled to undertake mini-

pupillage here. Please direct any inquiries in this regard in the first instance to **5RB**'s Clerks.

Finally, for monitoring purposes, we would ask you to complete and return to us with your application form **5RB**'s **Equal Opportunities monitoring form**, a copy of which is attached. You are not obliged to complete the monitoring form and it will not be seen by those who consider your application for mini-pupillage.
